The South Central Coastal Information Center received your records search request for the project area referenced above, located on the Baldwin Park, CA and La Habra, CA USGS 7.5' quadrangle. The following summary reflects the results of the records search for the project area and a ½-mile radius. The search includes a review of all recorded archaeological and built-environment resources as well as a review of cultural resource reports on file. In addition, the California Points of Historical Interest (SPHI), the California Historical Landmarks (SHL), the California Register of Historical Resources (CAL REG), the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP), and the California State Historic Properties Directory (HPD) listings were reviewed for the above referenced project site. Due to the sensitive nature of cultural resources, archaeological site locations are not released.

HISTORIC MAP REVIEW – Pomona, CA () USGS 15': indicated that in 1894, there appeared to be one road and two buildings within the project site. There were also four roads and five buildings within the vicinity of the project area. San Jose Creek ran through the project site. The Southern Pacific Railroad ran to the north of the project site. Historic place names nearby included Rowland Siding. In 1904, all previously mentioned features still remained.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The project area is potentially sensitive for cultural resources. Previous surveys in the area have identified Native American artifacts, fresh water resources (San Jose Creek), natural tar seeps, and farm houses from at least 1924 or earlier. These are all indicators of potential sensitivity. Therefore, it is recommended that a qualified archaeologist be retained to survey the area prior to the approval of any project plans. Additionally, areas that are currently obscured by permanent or temporary materials may need to be surveyed once these items are no longer in place. It is also recommended that any historic buildings, structures or objects (45 years and older and in the area of potential effect) be identified, recorded, and evaluated for local, state, or national significance prior to the approval of project plans. Finally, the Native American Heritage Commission should be consulted to identify if any additional traditional cultural properties or other sacred sites are known to be in the area.

Dear Michael:

I have conducted a thorough search of our Vertebrate Paleontology records for the proposed Warehouse Building Project, in the City of Industry, Los Angeles County, project area as outlined on the portion of the Baldwin Park USGS topographic quadrangle map that you sent to me via e-mail on 20 November 2015. We do not have any vertebrate fossil localities that lie directly within the proposed project area boundaries, but we do have localities nearby or at distance from the same or similar sedimentary deposits as may occur at depth in the proposed project area.

Surface deposits in the entire proposed project area consist of younger Quaternary Alluvium, derived predominately as fluvial deposits from the San Jose Creek that flows adjacent to the northeast. These younger Quaternary deposits typically do not contain significant vertebrate fossils in the uppermost layers, but they are underlain at relatively shallow depth by older sedimentary deposits that may well contain significant vertebrate fossils. Our closest vertebrate fossil locality in somewhat similar Quaternary deposits is LACM 1728, situated east-southeast of the proposed project area in English Canyon south of Los Serranos, that produced fossil specimens of horse, *Equus*, and camel, *Camelops*, at a depth of 15 to 20 feet below the surface. Our next closest vertebrate fossil localities from these Quaternary deposits are LACM 7701-7702, almost due west of the proposed project area in the City of Commerce near the intersection of Atlantic Avenue and the Long Beach Freeway (I-710), that produced fossil

specimens of threespine stickleback, *Gasterosteus aculeatus*, salamander, *Batrachoseps*, lizard, Lacertilia, snake, Colubridae, rabbit, *Sylvilagus*, pocket mouse, *Microtus*, harvest mouse, *Reithrodontomys*, and pocket gopher, *Thomomys*, at 11 to 34 feet below grade.

The surrounding elevated terrain has exposures of the marine late Miocene Puente Formation (also referred to as the Monterey Formation in this area), that probably underlie the Quaternary Alluvium in the proposed project area. Our closest vertebrate fossil localities in the Puente Formation, are LACM 6907-6908, southeast of the proposed project area between the Pomona Freeway (Highway 60) and Colima Road. A little further southeast of the proposed project area, south of Colima Road and just east of Fullerton Road, our locality LACM 7046 is also from the Puente Formation. Due east of the proposed project area we have the Puente Formation locality LACM 6170 on the north side of San Jose Creek south of Valley Boulevard. These Puente Formation localities have produced a suite of fossil marine vertebrates including bonito shark, *Isurus oxyrinchus*, top smelts, *Atherinops barkeri* and *Atherinopsis*, herrings, *Etringus scintillans* and *Ganolytes cameo*, halfbeack, *Zelosis hadleyi*, cod, *Eclipes*, anglerfish, *Acentrophryne longidens*, lanternfish, Myctophidae, jack, *Decapterus*, snake mackerel, *Thyrsocles kriegeri*, croakers, *Seriphus lavenbergi* and *Lompoquia*, sanddab, Pleuronectiformes, viperfish, *Chauliodus eximius*, bristlemouth, *Cyclothone*, pipefish, *Syngnathus emeritus*, and whale, Cetacea. Specimens of the fossil pipefish, *Syngnathus emeritus*, from locality LACM 7046 were published in the scientific literature by R. A. Fritzsche (1980. Revision of the eastern Pacific Syngnathidae (Pisces: Syngnathiformes), including both Recent and fossil forms. Proceedings of the California Academy of Science, 42(6):181-227). Specimens of the fossil anglerfish, *Acentrophryne longidens*, from locality LACM 6908 was figured in the scientific literature by T. W. Pietsch and R. J. Lavenberg (1980. A fossil ceratoid anglerfish from the Late Miocene of California. Copeia, 1980(4):906-908). The fossil croaker, *Seriphus lavenbergi*, from locality LACM 6907 is a holotype (specimen that is used to describe a species new to science) described by R. W. Huddleston and G. T. Takeuchi (2006. A New Late Miocene Species of Sciaenid Fish, Based Primarily on an *in situ* Otolith from California. Bulletin of the Southern California Academy of Sciences, 105(1):30-42).

Shallow excavations in the younger Quaternary Alluvium exposed through the proposed project area are unlikely to encounter significant vertebrate fossils. Deeper excavations in the proposed project area that extend down into older sedimentary deposits, however, may well uncover significant fossil vertebrate remains. Any substantial excavations in the proposed project area, therefore, should be closely monitored to quickly and professionally collect any vertebrate fossil remains without impeding development. Also, sediment samples should be collected and processed to determine the small fossil potential in the proposed project area. Any fossils recovered during mitigation should be deposited in an accredited and permanent scientific institution for the benefit of current and future generations.

This records search covers only the vertebrate paleontology records of the Natural History Museum of Los Angeles County. It is not intended to be a thorough paleontological survey of the proposed project area covering other institutional records, a literature survey, or any potential on-site survey.
