## **New Report Credits City of Industry for 209,000 Jobs in the Los Angeles County Region Report Released Today Details the City's Economic Impact in the San Gabriel Valley and Larger Los Angeles County Region**

City of Industry, CA – Today, the City of Industry City Council received a presentation of an Economic Analysis Study of the City of Industry.

The study, compiled by Emerson Consulting Group, concludes that the City *“significantly contributes to the economy in terms of businesses, sales and employment in Los Angeles County and San Gabriel Valley. Given the economic inter-connectivity of the City of Industry with the larger Los Angeles community, economic growth and development depends on their mutual prosperity”*.

“The economic report’s conclusions demonstrate that the City of Industry’s focus on manufacturing, logistics, and wholesale trade benefits the entire region,” said Mayor Mark Radecki. “We are a unique city dedicated to supporting businesses that employ tens of thousands of Southern California residents. We are committed to identify and support new programs and opportunities that will make it easier for businesses to stay, expand, and relocate here.”

Key highlights of the study include:

- There are approximately 3,000 businesses operating in the City of Industry.
- There are approximately over 67,000 people employed at businesses located in the City.
- The largest business sectors include:
  - 21 percent of employment are retail trade
  - 21 percent of employment are manufacturing
  - 16 percent of employment are wholesale trade
- The total contribution of the City of Industry to the Los Angeles County region is 209,000 jobs, \$19 billion of labor income, and \$52 billion of sales.
- The total contribution of the City of Industry to the San Gabriel Valley is 215,000 jobs, \$19.6 billion of labor income, and \$54.5 billion of sales.
